**THE WILDLIFE CONSERVATION (MANAGEMENT OF WILDLIFE
CAPTIVE FACILITIES) (AMENDMENT) REGULATIONS, 2024**

Citation GN No. 283 of 2020	1. These Regulations may be cited as “the Wildlife Conservation (Management of Wildlife Captive Facilities)(Amendment) Regulations, 2024 and shall be read as one with the Wildlife Conservation (Management of Wildlife Captive Facilities) Regulations, 2020 hereinafter referred to as the “principal Regulations”.
General amendment	2. The principal Regulations are amended generally by deleting the term Director General wherever it appears and substituting for it with the term “Conservation Commissioner”.
Amendment of regulation 2	3. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 2 by-
	(a) deleting the definition of the words “Director General”;
	(b) inserting in the appropriate alphabetical order for the following new definitions:
GN No. 135 of 2014	“"Board" means the Board of Directors of Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority established by the Wildlife Conservation (Tanzania Wildlife Management Authority) Establishment Order;
	“filial generation” means offspring produced by a set of parents in a controlled environment;
	“multi-use wildlife captive facility” means a wildlife captive facility that involves keeping wild animals for non-consumptive or consumptive wildlife utilization activities or both in an area which is also used for other recreational or residential activities;

	“professional guide” means a person who guides, leads, directs, or accompany visitors in a wildlife captive facility;
Cap 113	“right of occupancy” shall have a meaning as ascribed under the Land Act.”
Amendment of regulation 5	4. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 5 by
	(a) deleting subregulation (2) and substituting for it the following:
	“(2) The Conservation Commissioner shall receive applications for registration of wildlife captive facilities”
	(b) deleting subregulation (3) and substituting for it the following:
	“(3) The application referred to under subregulation (1) shall be submitted to the Conservation Commissioner, accompanied with:
	(a) a certificate of right of occupancy;
	(b) a business plan or a project proposal of the undertaking;
	(c) proof of payment of the application fees set out in the Second Schedule;
	(d) tax clearance certificate;
	(e) a copy of memorandum and articles of association, if the applicant is a body corporate;
	(f) a copy of tax payer identification number; and
	(g) a copy of certificate of registration or a certificate of incorporation if the applicant is a limited company;”
Amendment of regulation 6	5. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 6 by:
	(a) deleting the words "or sanctuary" wherever they appear in the regulation and substituting for them the words "sanctuary or Multiuse wildlife captive facility"
Amendment of regulation 9	6. The principal Regulations are amended in Regulation 9 by-
	(a) deleting 9 (2)
	(b) Renumbering subregulation (1), (2), (3) and (4) as subregulation (1), (2) and (3)
	(c) deleting 9 (1) as renumbered and substituting for it the following;
	“The Conservation Commissioner shall after receipt of applications made under sub regulation 5(2)-
	(a) nominate a team of at least three authorized officers to inspect the premises in respect of which the application has been lodged;
	(b) require the team to submit a written recommendations within twenty one days from the date of nomination as to whether–
	(i) the application may be accepted or rejected; or

	(ii) the application may be accepted on conditions.”
	(d) deleting 9 (2) as renumbered and substituting for it the following:
	“After considering the advice of the team, the Conservation Commissioner may-
	(a) grant a certificate of registration upon payment of registration fee as set out in the Second Schedule;
	(b) grant a certificate of registration subject to certain conditions upon payment of registration fee as set out in the Second Schedule; or
	(c) reject the application and provide reasons thereof.”
	(e) deleting 9 (4) as renumbered and substituting for it the following:
	“The Conservation Commissioner shall, within ten working days after making a decision on an application, notify the applicant in writing”
Amendment of regulation 10	7. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 10 by:
	(a) deleting subregulation (3)
	(b) renumbering subregulation (4), (5), (6) and (7) as subregulation (3), (4), (5) and (6)
	(c) deleting subregulation (3) as renumbered and substituting for it the following;
	“The certificate of registration shall be valid for six years subject to renewal and shall not be transferable.”
	(d) deleting subregulation (5) as renumbered
	(e) renumbering subregulation (6) as subregulation (5).
Amendment of regulation 11	8. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 11 (1) (b) by deleting the word “or any other relevant law” immediately after word “Regulations”.
Amendment of regulation 12	9. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 12 by:
	(a) deleting the word “and” immediately after paragraph (e); and
	(b) adding immediately after paragraph (f) the following new paragraphs.
	“(g) ensure that there is no direct contact between any human being and any carnivore, except carnivore bred from Filial four generation in captivity and raised under similar environment;
	(h) ensure that there is a standoff barrier between client and any animal in a wildlife

	captive facility;
	(i) ensure that all activities related to wildlife use are conducted under close guidance of wildlife captive facility's professional guide; and
	(j) ensure high standard of safety for all visitors at all times.”
	Provided that, the owner of the captive facility intending to conduct business involving direct contact between wild animal and human being shall prove that, that animal is from filial four generation.”
Amendment of regulation 19	10. The principal Regulations are amended in Regulation 19 by:
	(a) deleting the word “quota” appearing in subregulation 3(a) and substituting for it the words “list of animal species”
	(b) adding paragraph (e) immediately after paragraph (d) in subregulation (3) :
	“(e) capture parent stock in open areas and Wildlife Management Areas.”
	(c) adding immediately after subregulation 4 the following:
	“(5) An operator of wildlife captive facility granted a capture permit and fails to capture the specified animal within the specified period shall be given an extension period of thirty days upon payment of extension fee of 15% of the value of the animals to be captured during the extension period.
	(6) Capturing of parent stock in Wildlife Management Areas shall be in line with the Resource Zone Management Plan or General Management Plan.”
Amendment of regulation 22	11. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 22 by-
	(a) deleting the words “maintaining register of animal species” appearing in marginal note and substituting with the words “keeping a register of animal species”
	(b) deleting regulation 22 and substituting for it the following:
	“22 (1) Every operator of a wildlife captive facility established in a controlled environment shall:
	(a) keep a register of animal population including any off-take, dead or newborn animals;
	(b) submit to the Conservation Commissioner a quarterly report of animal population kept in that wildlife captive facility; and
	(c) be issued with a certificate of ownership for new born animals upon payment of 20% of parent stock price.

	(d) adding immediately after subregulation 4 the following:
	“(5) Death of any animal in the wildlife captive facility shall be reported in writing to the Conservation Commissioner and be accompanied by a post mortem report.”
Amendment of regulation 23	12. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 23 by-
	(a) adding immediately after subregulation (1) the following subregulation:
	“(2) Capture of parent stock may be conducted in open wildlife ranch provided that the operator of open wildlife ranch has -
	(a) accepted the request for capture of parent stock from his facility;
	(b) submitted to the Conservation Commissioner a list of animal species to be captured for scrutinization and approval, provided that animals to be captured are for parent stock only; and
	(c) paid the relevant parent stock price.”
	(b) renumbering subregulation (2) as subregulation (3).
Amendment of regulation 24	13. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 24 by:
	(a) adding the words “and public captive facility” after the word “ranch” appearing in subregulation (1);
	(b) adding immediately after subregulation (2) the following:
	(3) For the purposes of this Regulation, public captive facility means the captive facility established and managed by the Government.”
Amendment of Section 25	14. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 25 by-
	(a) deleting subregulation (1) and substituting for it the following:-
	“(1) An operator of open wildlife ranch, who intends to conduct consumptive use of wildlife shall adhere to the following conditions:
	(a) has paid user right fee as prescribed under the Eighth Schedule;
	(b) has obtained a written permission and animal quota from the Conservation

	Commissioner.”
	(b) adding immediately after sub regulation (1) the following
	“(2) without prejudice to subregulation (1) an operator of the facility shall pay to the Authority the permit and game fee for animal hunted in accordance with the Wildlife Conservation (Tourist Hunting) Regulations.”
	(c) renumbering subregulation (2) as subregulation (3)
	(d) deleting subregulation (3) as renumbered and substituting for it the following-
	“(3) An operator of a closed wildlife ranch, breeding facility and wildlife farm, who intends to conduct consumptive use of wildlife shall adhere to the following conditions:
	(a) submit to the Conservation Commissioner a list containing the number of animal species to be hunted in respect of tourist or resident hunting;
	(b) obtained a written permission and animal quota from the Conservation Commissioner.”
	(c) pay to the Authority 15% of game fee for every animal hunted in the wildlife captive facility in accordance with the Wildlife Conservation (Tourist Hunting) Regulations; and
	(d) in case of subsistence hunting for locals and residents, pay to the Authority 15% of the fee for every animal hunted in the wildlife captive facility in accordance with the Wildlife Conservation (Subsistence Hunting) Regulations.
Amendment of regulation 30	15. The principal Regulations are amended in regulation 30 by deleting the words "and revocation of a certificate of registration" appearing immediately after the word "and".
Amendment of the First Schedule	16. The principal Regulations are amended in the First schedule by:
	(a) deleting the words “WF No.” and substituting for them “WF/WCF No.”.
Deleting and substituting Second Schedule	17. The principal Regulations are amended by deleting and substituting the Second Schedule as follows:
